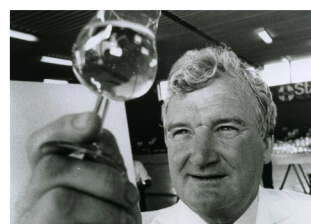
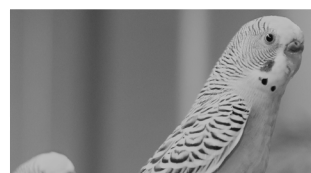
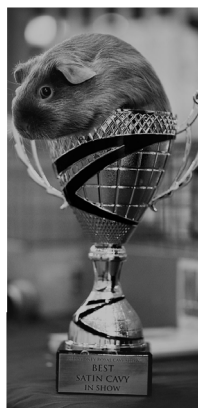

All ANCATS shows are open style judging, you can watch your cat being judged.

JUDGING

Judging will commence at 9am sharp.

PAVILION

The 2022 ADVANCE™ Sydney Royal Cat Show will be held in Hall 3 - Pet Pavilion. The Pavilion will be open to the public from 9am to 7pm.

EXHIBITION OF CATS

Cages are provided at the show, these are cleaned and disinfected. Please do not use any disinfectants in the cages as it may react with the material of the cage, which is fibreglass. All Exhibitors must supply a base of towelling or cotton measuring 560mm x 510mm. Plain coloured bases are permitted. Items such as lace, ribbon, cord, food bowls or soft toys must not be left in cages. Any items that could become entangled will be removed by the Chief Steward.

All Exhibits must remain in the Pavilion until 5pm. Only the Owner, or their representative, may remove the Exhibit at the end of the day.

VETTING

Vetting will be conducted from 7am to 8.30am. No late vetting will be conducted.

AMENDMENT TO JUDGING TIMETABLE

ANCATS reserves the right to change the Judging timetable if necessary.

PARKING

Parking is not included with your ticket purchase. Parking must be purchased directly from Sydney Olympic Park Authority. The P5 car park is traditionally the car park that is used for parking at the show. This is the only car park that can be used for access to the showground if you are walking in with your cats.

We recommend that you book a spot early do avoid missing out.

EXHIBITOR CONFIRMATION ADVICE & DASHBOARD SLIPS

The Exhibit Confirmation Advice, otherwise known as a bench slip, indicates the Class in which your cat/s have been entered, and is required for access to the Showground. A Dashboard Slip will also be issued to Exhibitors with the Showtime Authorised Contact Person's mobile number printed on the slip. A Dashboard Slip must be displayed on the dashboard of each vehicle at all times while on the Showground.

EXHIBITOR PASSES

1 - 2 cats: Two (2) one-day entry pass
3 - 5 cats: Three (3) one-day entry passes.
More than 5 cats: Four (4) one-day entry passes.

John Smithson - CATZINC NZ

John has been involved in the cat fancy for over 40 years, 36 as a judge, 31 of those as an All-Breed judge. He has held many offices, from NZCF Editor in 1980, to Regional Director, and serving a term as National President of the New Zealand Cat Fancy, in 1993.

His hobbies include music, art, and feline history, and he takes time to enjoy, continually learn about, and contribute to each. He is an accomplished artist, specialising in Pen and Ink using the pointillist technique, with his animal portraits and pastoral works are gracing the walls of homes in many countries.

Nearing retirement, he fulfils his passion for things feline, by writing history, spending innumerable hours every month seeking out rare historical documents, photographs, and artifacts, that have hitherto remained hidden from sight; thoroughly researching every find to work out what they each reveal about the breeds and people involved with them, then fitting this into his already heavy writing schedule. He is currently, Curator of The Harrison Weir Collection; a Director of the CFA Foundation, Inc.; Editor of the e-magazine 'Felis Historica'; a joint founder/collaborator and writer for 'The History Project' at www.cat-o-pedia.org and remains an active Tutor All-Breeds Judge with the NZCF, Inc.

John has been a guest speaker at the World Cat Congress. His research has taken him to the United Kingdom, where he has lectured on the life of British listed artist Harrison Weir, (known as the Father of the Cat Fancy), to research at both the Bodleian Library at Oxford, and the V & A Museum in London; to the United States, where he collaborates with the CFA Foundation Inc., at their Feline Historical Museum on several joint projects, including the 'Alchemy of Cat Breeds' series of books of which this is just one.

My interest in animals has lasted for as long as I can remember, starting with childhood interests in guinea pigs, mice, a cat and poultry.

It was near the end of my High School education that I became interested in pedigree poultry, breeding Minorcas and at this time purchased my first Afghan Hound. This led to many years of exhibiting, breeding and judging dogs.

Thirty years ago I purchased a house from a previous fellow Afghan Hound exhibitor and he also had two Birman breeding queens. Due to his circumstances he offered Kanjiro Anna and her daughter Kanjiro Denna to Val Richards and I. The Birmans were bred under Val's Tajomeer prefix for many years. Her first litter (from Anna) produced Double Grand Champion Tajomeer Breakfast At Tiffany's (the highest level of show award possible at the time).

When Val decided to no longer continue, I took the Birman's over under my prefix of Chalfont, named for Chalfont St Giles where my Payne family originated in England. The first Chalfont litter arrived in April, 2007 and I have continued with this to this day. I have enjoyed success over many years, including Supreme Best in Show at the 2016 NZ National with Chalfont Uncle Sam.

I have been privileged to judge throughout New Zealand and Australia at multiple Birman Breed Specialty Shows and All Breeds Shows and very much look forward to the opportunity of judging the beautiful cats of Australia again.

Education has been a passion and I continued to do management and administrative diplomas which lead to several overseas trips as a New Zealand representative. Appointed to NZCF Judges Council, a tutor judge, a delegate. Currently I am show Secretary for Mid Island Cat Club and was an inaugural member for this club in 1982. Recently I was honoured as a life member of the club.

I love meeting people and cats and always feel privileged to judge beautiful, healthy cats whose owners love and care for them as they would their own family.
